The Spruce Hill Resort/Spa campground:

4871 Cariboo Highway 97, 8 miles (13km) north of 100 Mile House (right side of highway if heading north). Turn off the highway at the Spruce Hill Resort and Spa sign and travel down the easy gravel road (not far) and watch for the horse camp sign and then you will turn left. Go slow or you will miss it! If travelling from the north (on Highway 97), watch for the Spruce Hill Resort and Spa sign after you have passed the 108 Mile Heritage site/108 Mile Lake. The Ranch is on your left.

You must reserve your campsite/paddock *as soon as possible after you have sent in your entry*. Reserve (via VISA/mastercard etc) by contacting Spruce Hill Resort via phone at: 1-800-668-2233 or 250-791-5225. The camping fee of \$25.00 per night *per rig* (*please note this is new*) includes a camp site, <u>RUSTIC</u> corral (first come, first served), access to water and use of the showers and indoor pool and whirlpool at the lodge. There are trees for highlining as well. The lodge has 2 restaurants-only a short walk from the campground. For general info on the resort, or to book a spa treatment pre/post ride, visit their website (http://www.sprucehillresort.com/). Please note: *no dogs allowed on trails. Dogs must be well behaved and contained at all times*-thank you. Due to the tinder dry forests, there will be *no smoking* on trails or in the open area of camp. There will likely be a ban on campfires as well.

Schedule:

- •mandatory weigh in for all riders during Friday registration (rider's weight plus tack). Check in/registration commences after 12:30.
- •vetting in starts Friday approx. 2:30. Upon arrival you will receive a "time" for vetting in (to avoid line ups). No vetting in on Saturday.
- •Friday pizza dinner at approximately 6 pm (listen for car horn). Ride briefing will commence approx. 6:30pm.
- •Saturday post ride dinner at approximately 5:30pm at the campground. Don't forget to purchase significant other meal(s) at \$10.00 each meal and add to your entry.

Trail/area description:

•mix of terrain: flat grassy trails, rolling hills, some hard-packed trails and rocky trails. Cattle range in this area and there will be the odd gate that must be opened and closed. Shoes or hoof protection recommended.

Rules:

- •CTR rules apply and can be downloaded from the club's website at: erabc.com
- •it is the responsibility of each rider to know the CTR rules.
- •proper riding helmets are mandatory.
- •Ride manager is responsible for enforcing rules and overseeing any problems or disputes.

Code of Conduct and Ride Release Waiver:

•no rider will be allowed entry to the Cariboo Plateau CTR without having signed the "Code of Conduct" and the "Ride Release Waiver". Each rider will be responsible for their behavior towards other persons and will be responsible for the actions and behavior of their horse at the ride site, on the roads and trails.
